

Parents' Guide to using X-box or Playstation to access Home Learning

If you have a Play Station or Xbox at home, you should be able to use it to access the home learning we are providing for pupils. This may mean less sharing of devices, or pupils may just feel more comfortable using a console they are very familiar with.

Please see the information below to find out how to access home learning via your console.

Using X-box or PlayStation to access home learning

Xbox

1. Plug a keyboard in to the Xbox USB slot (or use Bluetooth to connect if supported)
2. Go in to my games and apps
3. Find Microsoft Edge and select
4. Search for Office 365 and log in as normal
5. To move around, use the Xbox controller

PlayStation

1. Add a keyboard using a USB or Bluetooth
2. Identify the PlayStation internet browser icon (it is WWW with dots around it)
3. Press the PlayStation logo on the controller
4. Go to the library and find options for games and applications
5. Go in to applications and you will find the internet browser
6. Search for Office 365 and log in as normal

Using a mouse instead of the controller may be the easiest way to navigate, if it is compatible with your browser/console.

If you have a headset and microphone, you can use that for Teams lessons.

You can access:

- Office 365
- PowerPoint
- Teams
- Epraise
- Word

Pupils can access Office365 by going to **www.office.com** and using their normal school username + @churchhill.sch.co.uk (e.g. **21bloggsjoe@churchhill.worcs.sch.co.uk**) and their normal school password (e.g. Bird1414) to log in. In Office365, pupils can access all of their files from school and Teams lessons.

Please ensure that appropriate parental controls are in place to safeguard children.
